B. Simplifying Customs Accreditation

The submission of Bureau of Internal Revenue Importer Clearance Certificate (ICC) and Broker's Clearance Certificate (BCC) have been removed.

Reduced the accreditation process from 11 steps to only 6 steps

D. Modernizing Operations and Systems

With the i-Track system, transit and transhipment container trucks are required to lock their containers using a GPS lock system which tracks the whereabouts of containers in transit or for transhipment.

Electronic Cargo Monitoring System (e-TCMS) or i-Track system is being piloted by the BOC.



Memorandum by Customs Commissioner Rey Leonardo Guerrero dated 12 February 2019 "Transfer of Empty Containers to Port of Batangas and to Subic Bay Freeport as Extension Ports of POM and MICP" reiterates Executive Order 172.

EO No. 172 Declaring **Port of Batangas and Subic Bay Freeport as Extensions of the Port** of Manila (MICT/ South Harbor) during **Port Congestion and** other Emergency Cases



CMO 13-2019 which addresses the issues that Customs stakeholders has raised on the return of Empty Containers was signed on February 28, 2019.

CMO 13-2019 entitled "Interim **Guidelines on the Return of Empty Containers at the Port** of Manila (POM) and **Manila International Container Port** (MICP)"



MICP created an oversight committee tasked to hasten proper disposal of overstaying containers to relieve pressure from the yard.

ICTSI repaired the bay doors of the Designated Examination Areas (DEAs) as requested by the District Collector.

The EMS is currently independent from E2M and was developed at MICP to address needs that E2M features cannot currently address. Its features include:

- monitoring of every shipment's weight, declared commodity, and value.
- inventory of entries filled at MICP
- real-time tracking of each entry's status along the Customs clearance process.

Created and deployed Entry Monitoring System (EMS)

The Aduana e-Library is a database of all available Customs issuances including Customs Memorandum Orders, Administrative Orders, Memorandum Circulars, and Special Orders. The website boasts a feature where the issuances can be retrieved through subject search, date, and type.
