

What is BCP?



BCP: BUSINESS CONTINUITY PLAN

- Ensures the continuous operations of a business during or after a disruptive event, regardless of location;
- > The BCP Committee develops and maintains the BCP;
- The BCP Committee works closely with the ERT— Emergency Response Team.



BCP vs DRP

SCENARIO:

Strong winds that damaged the structural integrity of the roof. This also damaged a significant number of computer units in the office.

BUSINESS CONTINUITY PLAN (BCP)

- Ensures the <u>operational continuity</u> of a business <u>in the</u> <u>event</u> of a significant disruption.
- ➤ What is the action plan under BCP?
- Find a temporary location for employees and provide back-up computers for uninterrupted work.

DISASTER RECOVERY PLAN (DRP)

- Restores normal business operations <u>after</u> a disruptive disaster / event.
- What is the action plan under DRP?
- Restore roof and replace computers using the same operating system.




